## **Conversation Flow Overview**

- The four main questions are in **BOLD**.
  - What did you want to be when you grew up?
  - What do you do today?
  - What would you do differently?
  - What is the typical career path for your role?
- The supporting questions listed under each of the four main questions may be asked depending on our conversation flow.
- The fifth question is for you to promote yourself, your company or other projects you are working on.
  - Are there any current projects you would like to share?
  - Keep in mind your podcast will post 3-5 weeks after our call so do not mention anything too soon.
- We close with a few questions around another passion of mine...cool cars. Don't worry if you do not have a good answer for these. That will happen.

Please be mindful that a large part of our audience will be comprised of elementary, high school and college students so any inappropriate language or references will be removed during editing.

## **Conversation Flow; Format and Questions**

Introduction – This is Learn from Others where we interview a cross-section of successful individuals so you can learn from their experiences, achievements and even their mistakes. We ask four questions that will educate and inspire! Greg Stanley will be your guide as we join our guest on a journey from adolescent daydreaming to success in today's world. Join us on this adventure as we Learn from Others together!

(Greg) – Welcome to Learn from Others where we help others succeed by sharing success. I'm excited to introduce our very special guest...guest's name. Guest's name thank you for taking us on YOUR career journey. Before we find out what you are doing today, let's start at the very beginning of your career journey.

- **Question #1 - What did you want to be when you grew up?**
  - What was your first job? This doesn't have to be one involving a W-2. I.e. Babysitting, mowing lawns, dog walking, etc.
  - What was your first "real" job? One in which you received a paycheck and paid taxes!
  - How did this first job shape or change your future goals?
  - What was your favorite subject or hobby in school?

(Greg) – Now that we understand the start of your career journey...

- **Question #2 - What do you do today?**

- Where do you work and what are your responsibilities?
- What is the end product of your work that our listeners would recognize?
- What past roles, jobs or experiences help prepare you to succeed in this role?
- What is your typical week like?
- What is the most challenging and rewarding aspects of your job?
- Can you share with us a challenge or failure you faced; whether it be with a career goal or a life experience and what you learned from it?
- How does your job align with your strengths and interests?

(Greg) – Before we move onto our next question, let's take a moment to hear from our sponsors.

(Greg) – Welcome back. We just learned what you wanted to be when you grew up and what you actually do today. So if you could do it all over again...

- **Question #3 - What would you do differently?**

- What advice would you give the younger you?
- Would you get different or additional education or experiences?
- Would you pursue a different vocation? If so, what?

(Greg) - Let's make the assumption that someone in our audience wants to be a your job title...

- **Question #4 - What is the typical career path for your position?**

- What is the best career advice you have ever received?
- Did you have a mentor and if so, how did they influence your career?
- Question #5 – What advice would you give a student who is in college right now?
- Question #5 - Are there any current projects you are working on that you would like to share?

(Greg) – And as with most journeys, success largely depends on reliable transportation and since I am a huge car enthusiast, could you tell us...

- Question #6 - What was your first car?
- Question #7 - What is your dream car?

(Greg) – One great perk to some jobs is a company car. If I could force \_\_\_ to provide you with a cool company car, I would recommend a...
